From the Desk of the Executive Director

ACEDC often partners regionally and on the state and federal levels to advance economic and community development in Addison County.

On the federal level, we are partnering with Senator Leahy and the US Department of Labor on a workforce development grant involving the Hannaford Career Center. We are also partnering with USDA/Rural Development on a feasibility study for EcoGlobal, LLC and the USDA/Rural Development Intermediary Relending program recently recapitalized our Revolving Loan Fund. We are also working on several US EDA grant applications to bring more resources to the region.

At the state level, we are partnering with the Agency of Commerce on the Capital Investment Program to fund several transitional projects in the region. We also recently partnered with the Vermont Department of Buildings and Services "Building Community" program to bring \$35,000 more in funding to the region to help grow two regional businesses.

Read more about these grants in this newsletter, along with our highlighted partner: the Addison County Regional Planning Commission. We are working with ACRPC on an EDA-funded Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS), an initiative requiring your input that will provide an Economic Development Strategy for the region that will be incorporated into ACRPC's Regional Plan and become ACEDC's Economic Strategy. We also worked on and submitted an application the EPA for brownfield remediation funding. If funded, we will be looking to identify development and redevelopment projects that re hindered by contamination. Finally, we are working with ACRPC on the annual Regional Priority Project list. This list is shared with state and federal funding agencies to indicate to them the projects that are priorities for our region as they make funding decisions.



## Agricola Meats Successfully Completes Kickstarter Campaign for Equipment to Expand Production

Alessandra Rellini and Stefano Pinna, ACEDC members and owners of Agricola Farm and Agricola Meats (Monti Verdi Salumi), have been hard at work caring for their land and animals, processing and curing their meat, AND raising much-needed funds to purchase equipment that will enable them to expand their product offerings and production at their facility in Middlebury.

Their successful Kickstarter campaign raised over \$33K in two weeks. These funds will be used as matching funds for a Vermont Working Lands Initiative grant and will allow Agricola

to offer a wider variety of cured meats, including coppa, guanciale, prosciuttini, pancetta, and lonzino.

Alessandra and Stefano are quick to acknowledge the help they've received from the Addison County Economic Development Corporation, including advice and expertise that have allowed them to grow their business. "I know we would not have done it without them," says Relleni. "It's definitely shocking how many small business resources are available, but the point is, do you know all of them and do you have a connection? When you get to the point that you don't know what to do, that's the time when you probably should reach out to the Addison County Economic Development Corporation because they can give you great advice."
